

Psychological Screening for Fertility Procedures

The need for psychological screening for the varied and arduous procedures associated with fertility treatments is obvious.

Following is a brief explanation of the types and costs of screenings.

Insurance does not cover screenings. Payment at the time of service can be made with check or credit card.

Donor Egg/Sperm Screening

Screening begins with a phone call to Dr. Pierce-Davis. She will schedule you as promptly as possible.

Before your appointment, you will need to fill out an information form. To find the form, click on the website Forms tab, download and print the Contact Information form specifically for fertility related services. Fill it out to bring with you to the session.

You will spend an hour with the doctor. She will ask you questions about your family, fertility history, your plans and preparations for starting or expanding your family, and answer any questions you might have about the psychological effects of donor egg. She will then compose your letter, and ask you to proof it for accuracy. You will receive a copy of the letter and she will mail a copy to your doctor. Cost: \$250.00

Screening for Gestational Carrier Or Known Egg Donor

Screening begins with a phone call to Dr. Pierce-Davis to arrange the following appointments:

- A couple appointment for the mother and father-to-be. This visit is described in “Donor Egg Screening,” to the left, cost \$250.00. Fill out Information forms for you and carrier/donor.
- An appointment with the carrier/donor for clinical interview and psychological testing. This will take approximately 2-3 hours.
- Dr. Pierce-Davis will then score and interpret the test, and write a Psychological Summary, cost \$450.
- Finally, the couple, donor/carrier and husband will meet as a group with Dr. Pierce-Davis for a one-hour question and answer session. Total Cost: \$700.00
